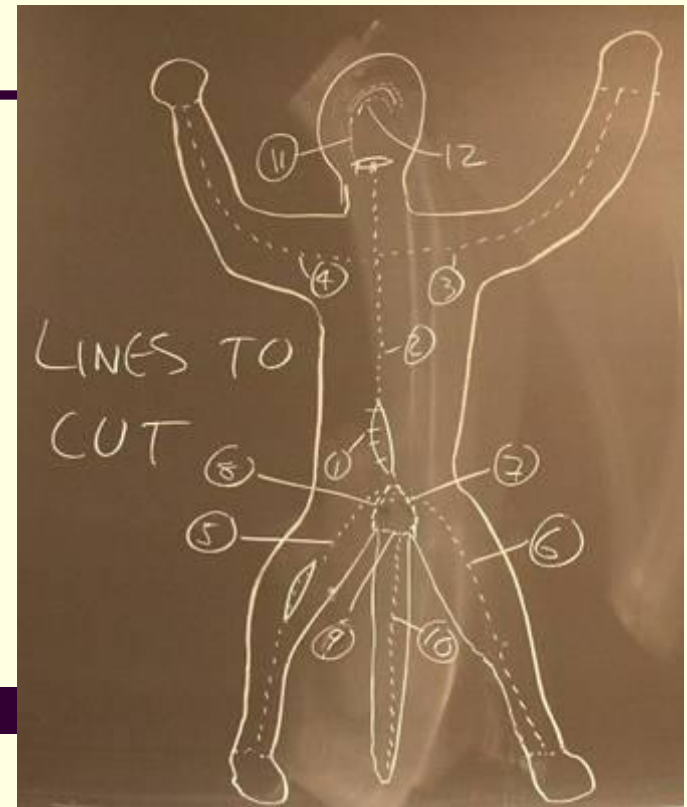

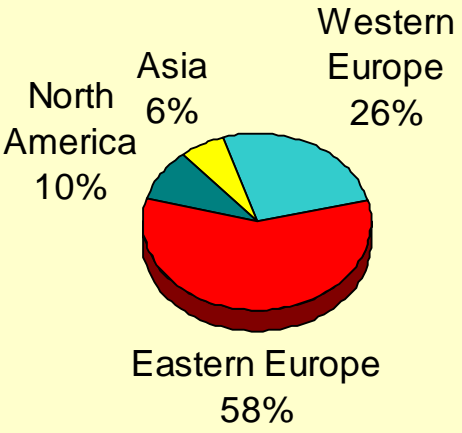

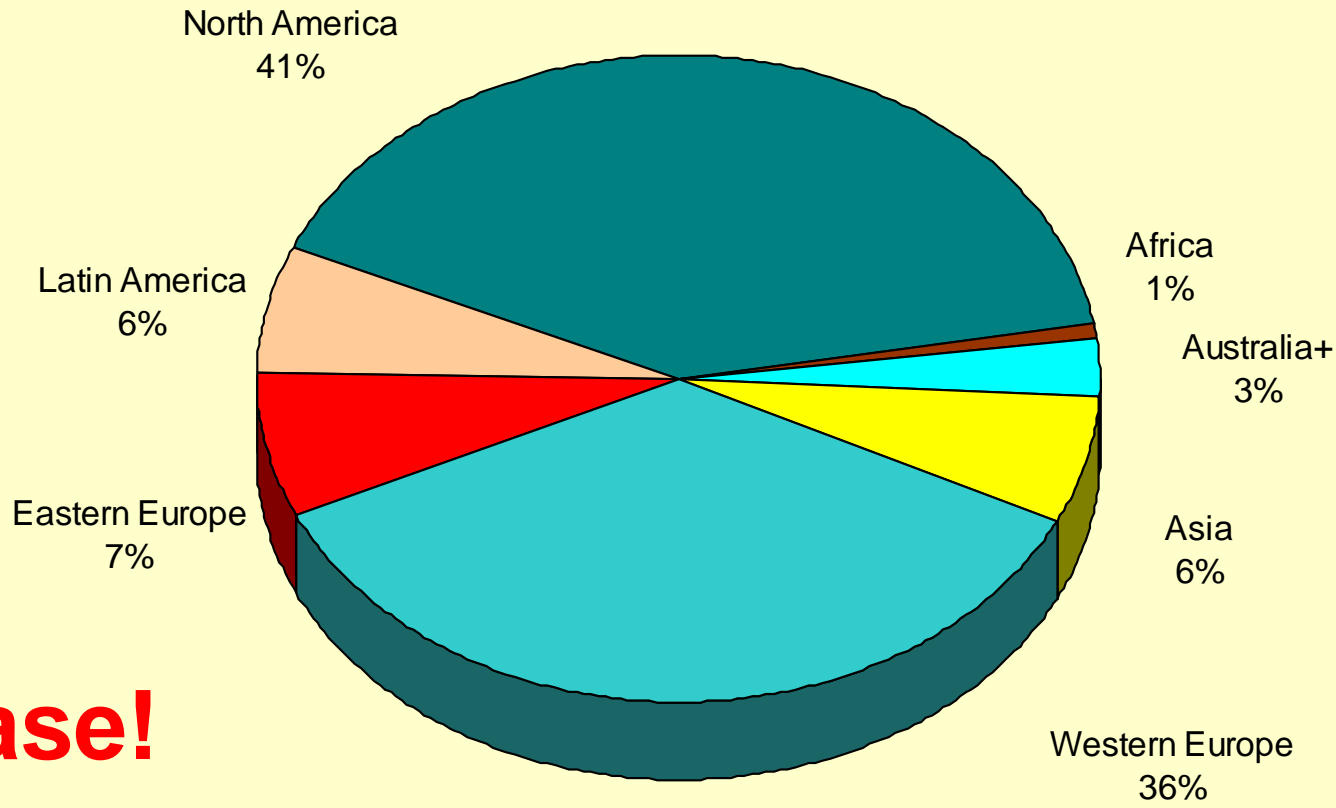

2009: 956 members

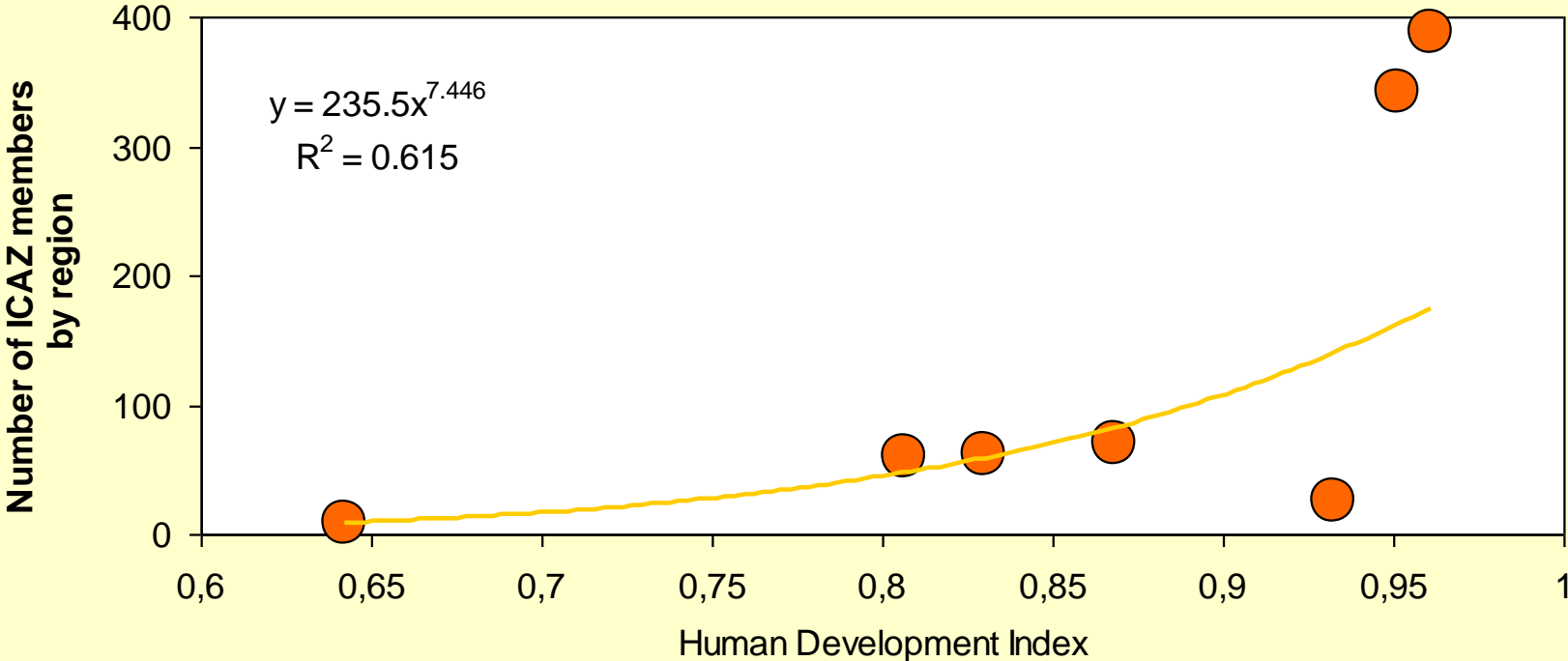
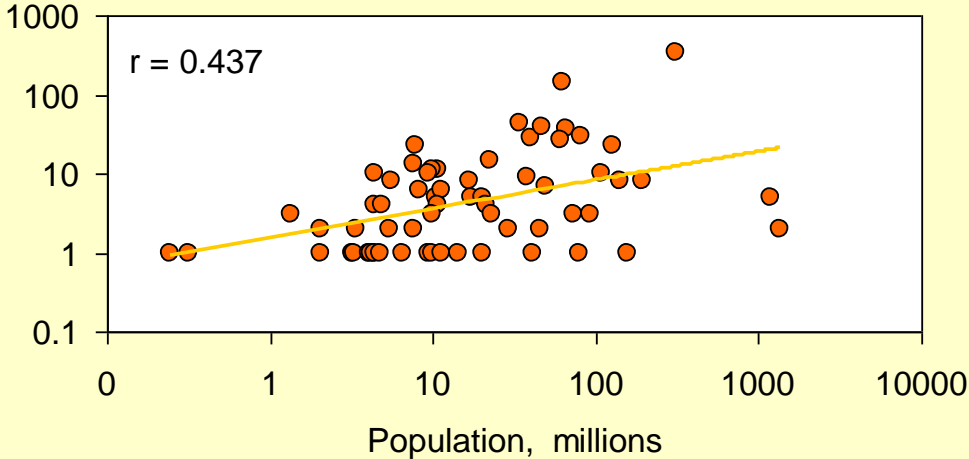

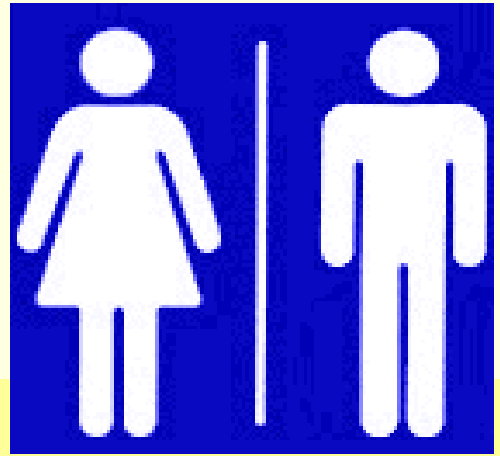
The Prince and the Pauper



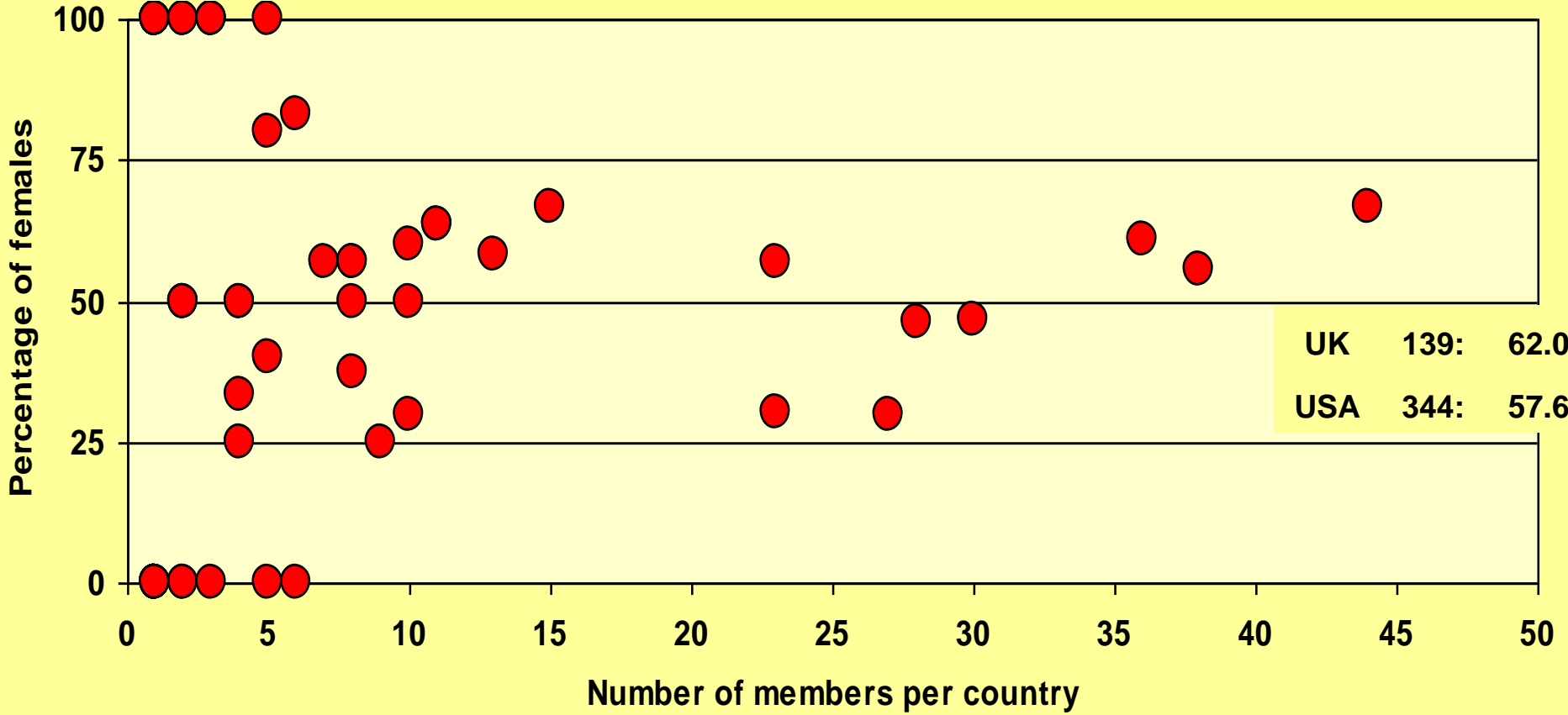
Number of ICAZ members in country



Distribution of the 2009 ICAZ membership by gender

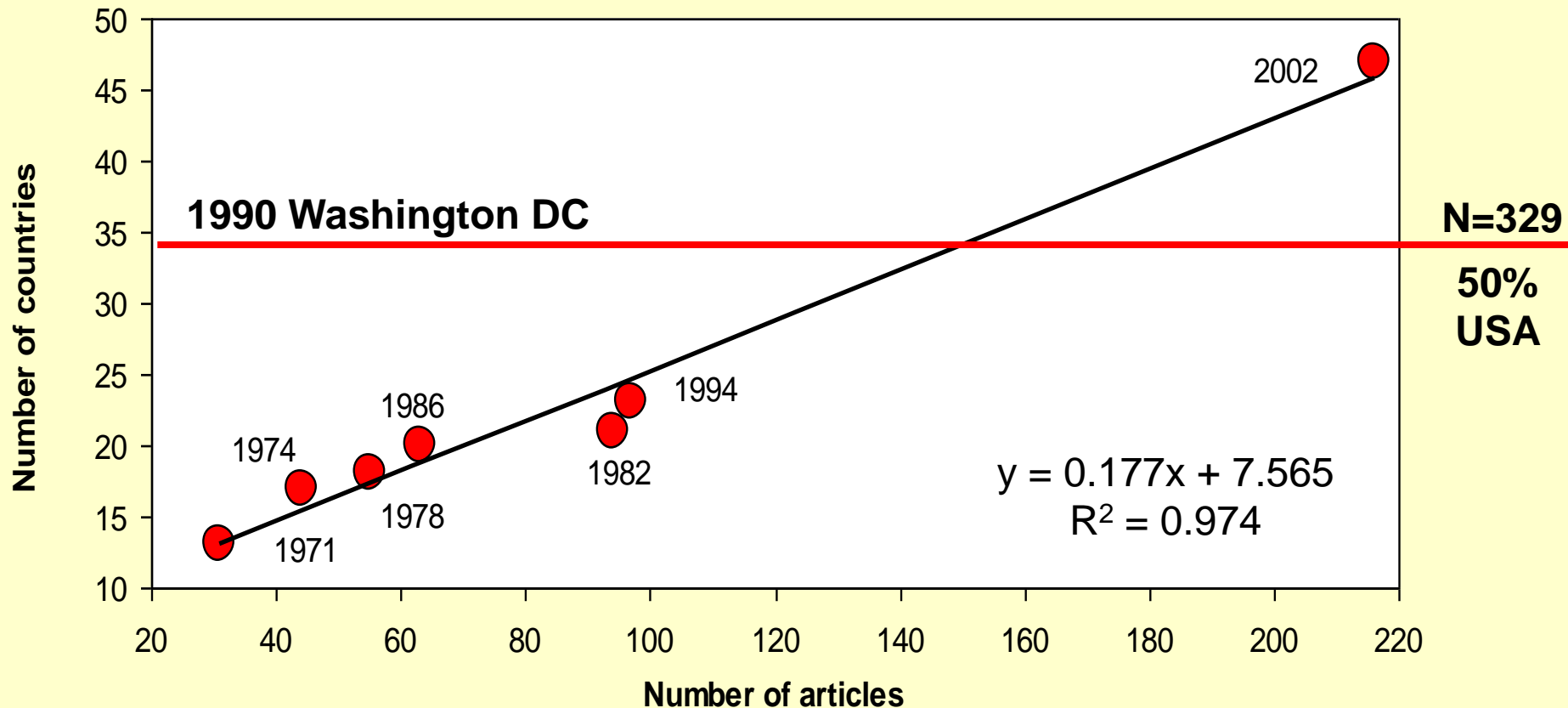

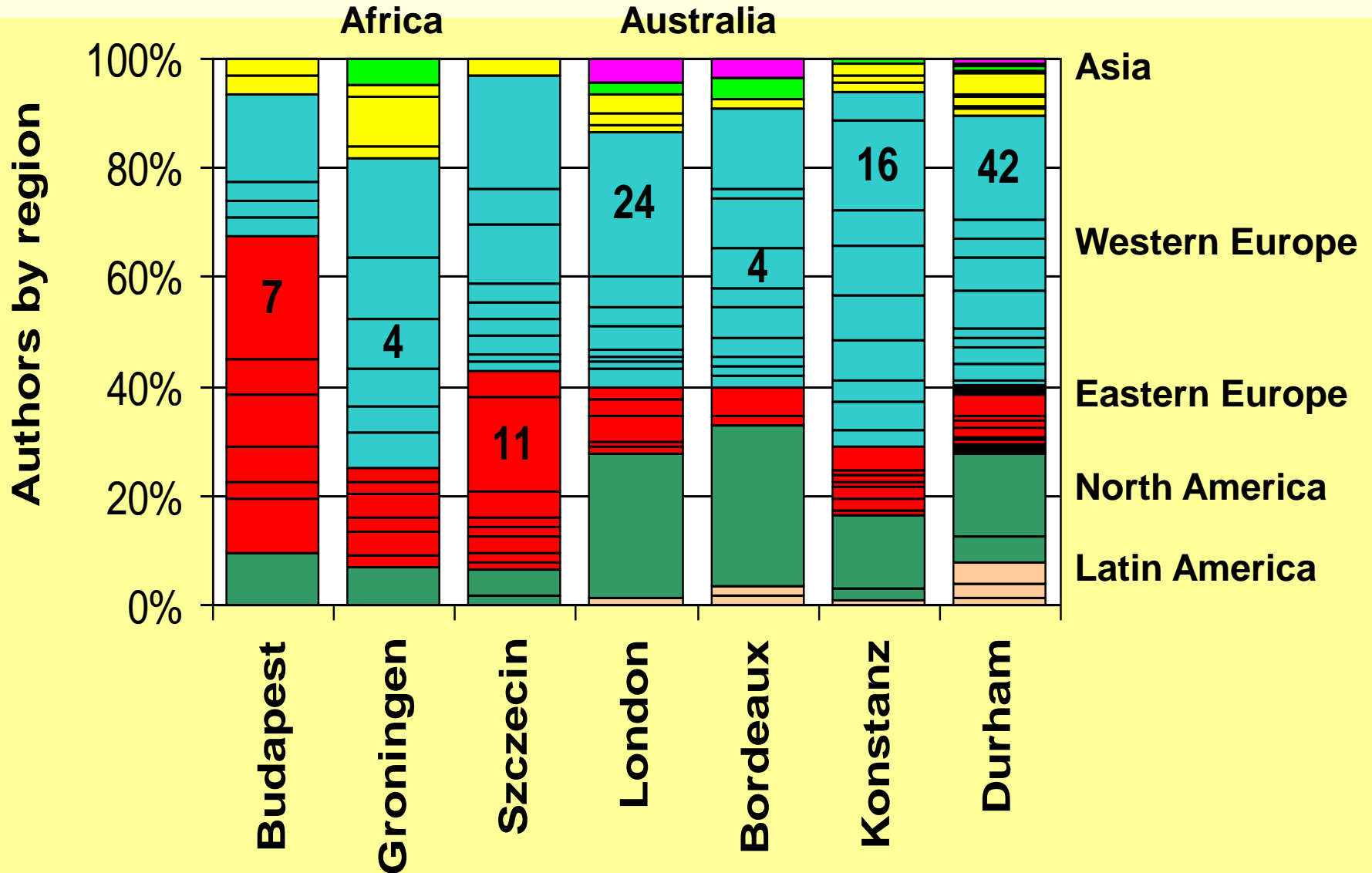




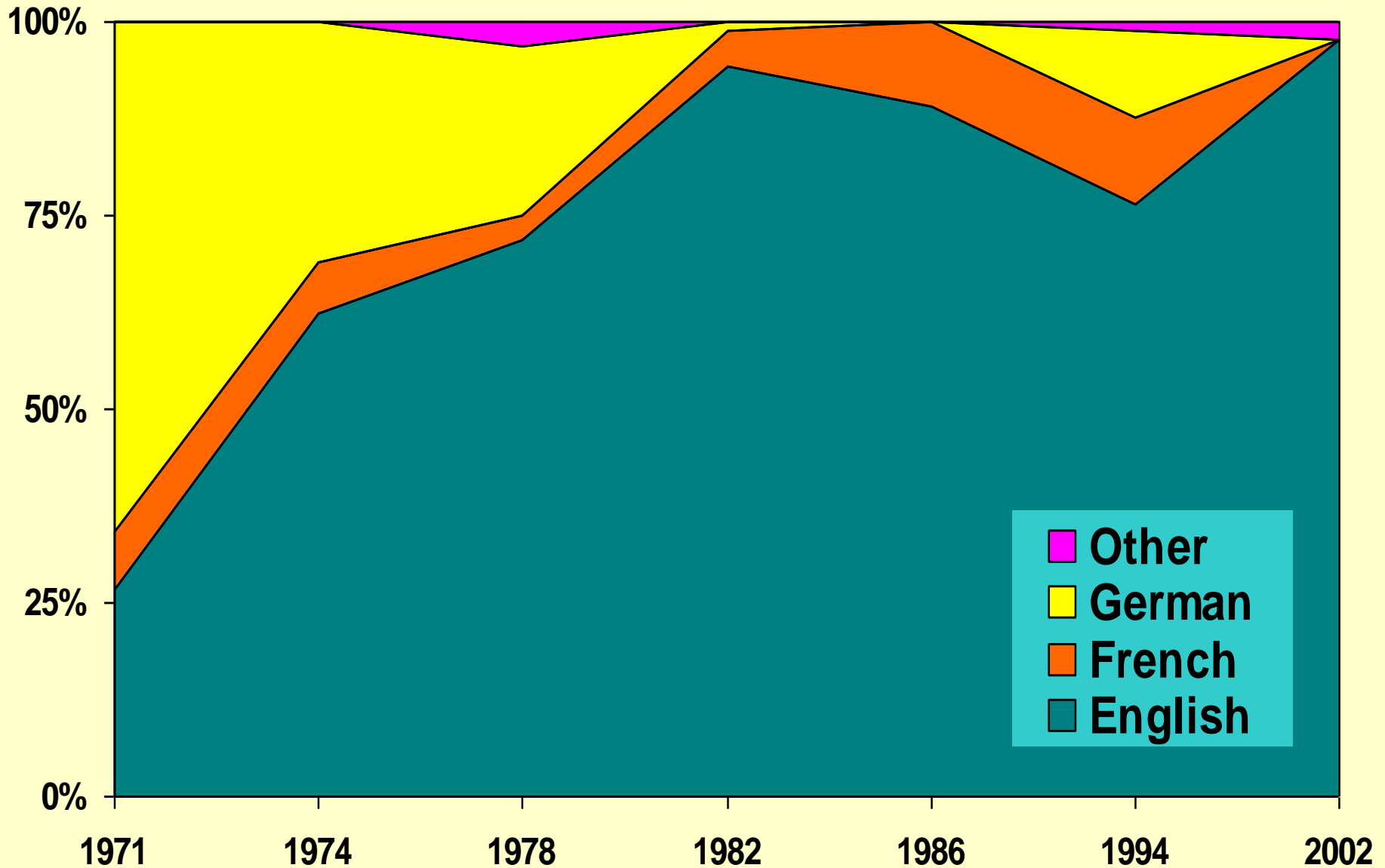
Contributions to conference proceedings by country: diversity is a function of sample size



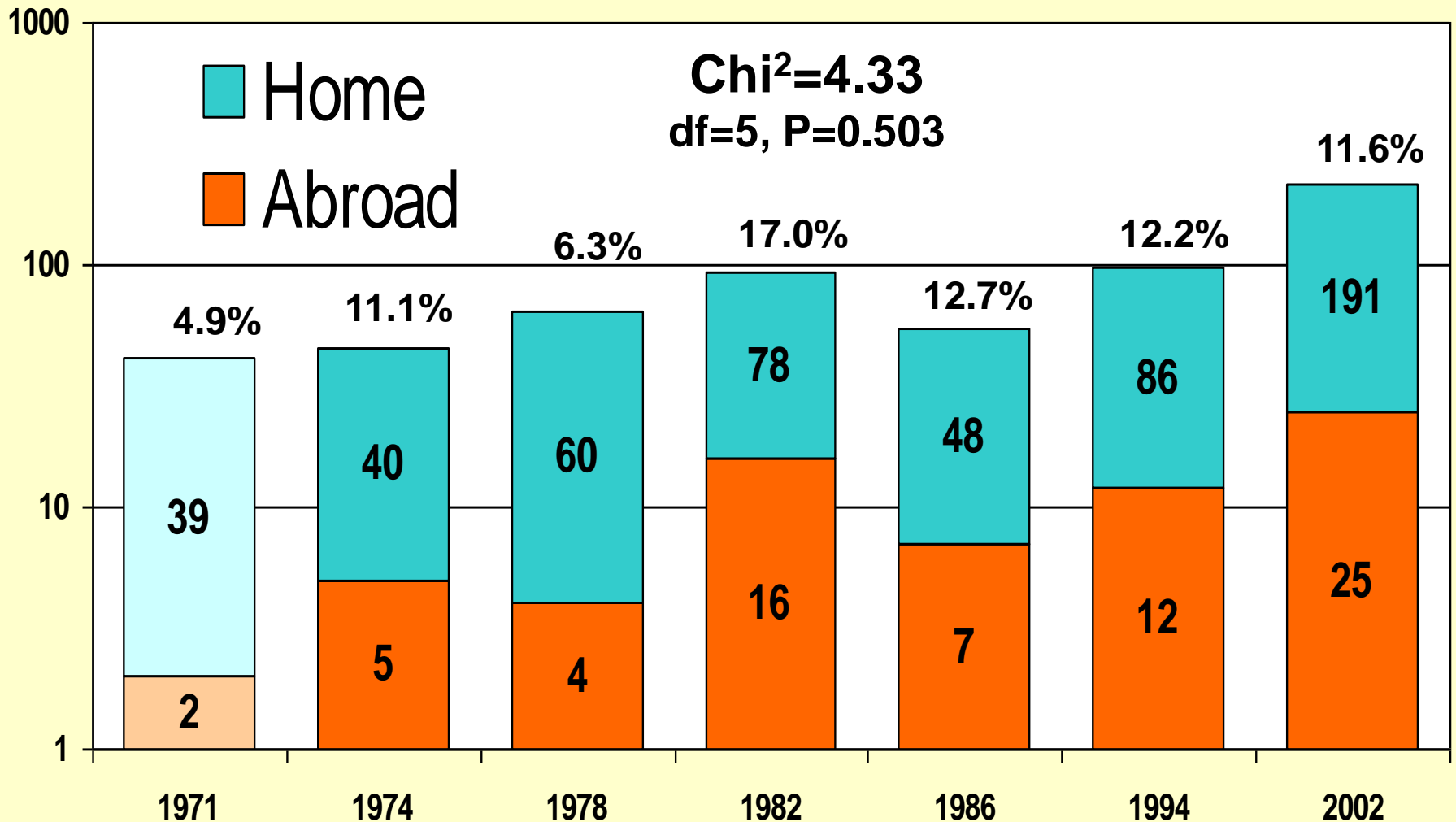
Regional representation in proceedings and the number of first authors from host countries



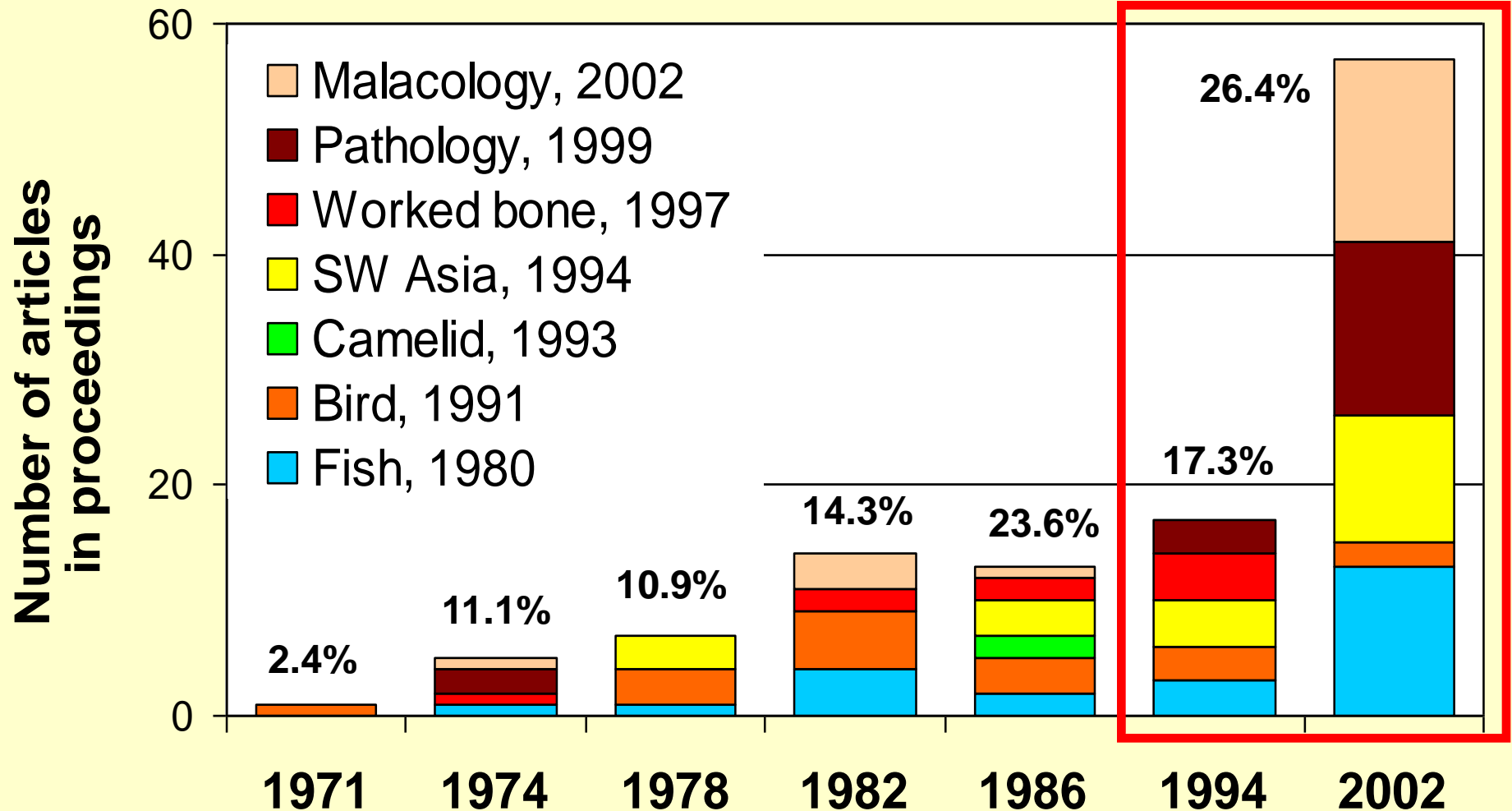
Diachronic trends in the language of publications

Conclusions

- The membership of ICAZ grew by a factor of **30** in **40** years
- International **diversity** increased proportionally
- Developed countries tend to be better represented, but **fair** financial comparisons will always be difficult to make
- Organizing countries **gain** well-deserved publicity from International Conferences
- Work abroad is represented slightly over **10%** in proceedings
- The increasing need for **specialized** Working Groups has shown in statistics since the very beginning
